DAY 01: ARRIVE KOLKATA

Arrive into Kolkata. You will be met on arrival at the airport. Proceed to Hotel. Check-in. Overnight in Kolkata.

Kolkata – the 330 years old city stands with its passionate culture & tradition, which is regarded as “The City of Joy” also known as “Cultural Capital of India”, is one of the metropolitan cities of the country & gateway of Eastern India too. Assistance on arrival at International Airport & transfer to hotel.

DAY 02: KOLKATA (TOUR NAME: RELIGIOUS REFORMS / 9AM - 5PM) Breakfast

Breakfast at Hotel. 9.00am - proceed on a tour named as ‘Religious Reforms’ – covers: Dakshineswar Kali Temple – the majestic temple is dedicated to mother Goddess Kali & also this temple is a great pilgrimage centre for Hindus, Belur Math – the temple originally conceived by Swami Vivekananda, this temple enshrines the sacred relics of Sri Ramakrishna, Jain Temple (Parashnath Temple)– an impressive structure consisting of mirror-inlaid pillars and windows that have made of stained glass, Kalighat Kali Temple – a Hindu Sacred Temple dedicated to the goddess Kali, it is one of the 51 Shakti Peethas, many considered that the name “Calcutta” is said to have been derived from the word “Kalighat” only. After tour back to Hotel. Rest of the evening at leisure. Overnight in Kolkata.

DAY 03: KOLKATA - CULTURAL REUNION / 9AM TO 5 PM) Breakfast

Breakfast. 9.00am - tour of Kolkata named as ‘Cultural Reunion’ – covering; Sri Aurobindo Bhavan – the place where Sri Aurobindo was born, was renovated and the sacred relics of Sri Aurobindo were enshrined, the memorial shrine has since become a place of pilgrimage. Swami Vivekananda’s House – Ramakrishna Mission Swami Vivekananda's Ancestral House and Cultural Centre is a museum and cultural centre, where Swami Vivekananda was born spend his childhood and early youth (Monday closed) Rabindranath Tagore’s House (also known as Jorasako Thakurbari) – the 18th century’s family house was built by the grandfather of Nobel Laureate Rabindranath Tagore, where he was born and passed away. Now been converted into a museum partially (Monday closed). Kumartuli (Potters’ Quarter) – world’s biggest clay-model market, where you will find the full house of artistic productions of these potters, College Street & Coffee House – a stretch of 1.5 kms long road which considered world’s biggest 2nd hand book market along with the many colleges, school & universities; it has played an important part in Calcutta's (Kolkata) cultural history and known as the hub of intellectual debates still date use to happening at Coffee House (Sunday closed). Mother House – the place where “Mother Teresa” used to live; now stands a tomb

with all her blessings over it (Thursday closed). After tour, back to Hotel. Evening at leisure. Overnight in Kolkata.

DAY 04: KOLKATA (HISTORICAL & COLONIAL REBIRTH / 9AM - 5PM) Breakfast DEPARTURE TO AIRPORT

Breakfast. 9.00am proceed to visit the tour: 'Historical & Colonial Rebirth' – covering; Flower Market – India's biggest flower market offers you to click some very colorful photographs & flower trading experience as well, Howrah Bridge – world's busiest bridge, build with the unique cantilever technology; one can walking over this busiest bridge if wish Dalhousie Square (Colonial Heritage Area) - the colonial part of Kolkata City, driving pass through Raj Bhawan (Governor's House), GPO & Postal Museum, Writers Building (Chief Minister Office), St. Andrew's Church and Currency Building, Victoria Memorial Palace & Museum – the largest repository in India for a visual history of Kolkata & also has a major collection of paintings, sculptures and manuscripts from the British period, St. Paul's Cathedral – build between 1839 to 1847 & became one of India's most important churches, Prinsep's Memorial & Riverfront of River Ganges – it's one of the oldest recreational spots of Kolkata, followed by enjoy hand-pulling boat ride on the River Ganges or walking along with the newly renovated Riverfront of River Ganges. Rest of the day is free for leisure or shopping. Later (2030 hrs) transfer to the airport for homebound flight.
